



# From the Provincial's Desk

The biannual meeting of the JCSA for 2020 was held in Godavari Kathmandu. The meeting began in the evening of Monday, 23<sup>rd</sup> with the Eucharistic celebration which followed the




inaugural session, welcoming all of the delegates by the Nepal Regional Superior Fr. Amrit Rai.

Fr. General and the Regional Assistant for South Asia were present and besides them Fr. Douglas Marcouiller, General Assistant for USA and Canada (USC) and Fr. Franck Janin, President of European Conference (JCEP) and Fr.Fr. Pierre Belanger the person in charge of the

Communication and Publication of the General Curia were also present with them.

The main topics presented and discussed at the meeting were the Orientation to be adapted for greater Apostolic Effectiveness aligning with the Universal Apostolic Preferences (UAPs) and the Conference Apostolic Preferences (CAPs). Fr. C.J Arun gave an all-inclusive presentation about the process aligning the UAPs with the CAPs.

Fr. General delivered his speech touching various topics currently influencing the Society of



Jesus. He spoke to us about the UAPs, the Universality of the worldwide Society and also about the Ignatian year (2021-2022).

When Fr. General touched upon the topic of the Universality he emphasized saying that; "this is a theme you have heard of, often. However, this time I want to stress the fact that the Society, more than ever before, is looking to South Asia to give the lead and provide for the future. You are aware that you have the largest number of Jesuits. If you have to provide the universal Society

with the kind of service that your numbers warrant, it is imperative that you form Jesuits who are men of competence, qualified and of spiritual and intellectual depth with the knowledge of at least another international language other than English. Self-confidence and a good self-image are also important requirements to serve the needs of the world-wide Society".

In his Final remarks Fr. General emphasized saying "before I end, I would like to remind you that we have taken steps forward in the process of beatification of Father Pedro Arrupe. The diocesan phase might be completed as early as the fall of this year. The petition will then pass on to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. I am convinced that the figure of Father Pedro Arrupe can be a source of inspiration for the Society of Jesus, for other religious communities, and for the whole Church. I invite you to continue praying for the recognition of the holiness of this faithful follower of Ignatius in our way of proceeding, a figure from whom we learn that we can advance in this way only by putting all our trust in Christ and only in him."

The Jesuits strongly feel the need to have a Technical Institute of their own for the sake of better administration and future growth as well as for the development of the youth apostolate in the Batticaloa District.

Dry weather and incidents of scrub fires these days have




created a water shortage in Cholankande area the CYTC too has been badly affected.

Overall they were happy with the training at Aluthgama-Dickoya but not so with Mount Jean and Tientsin. Though the teachers at Mount Jean and Tientsin went in the morning and received



training at Hatton from Mrs. Maria, they were not able to transfer the same training to the women in their respective villages in the evenings. However the students had their final exam on 27<sup>th</sup> February and it was unfortunate that no one from Tientsin attended the exam.

Inauguration of the renovated building and welcoming the new preschool students at



Welioya Estate: Last year CSC started its preschool at Welioya Estate in collaboration with another NGO and the parents. The building belongs to the NGO and the parents share in the expense with CSC in running the preschool. Thanks to the support of Swiss Jesuit Mission, CSC could renovate the dilapidated building and on 10<sup>th</sup> February Ms.

Soundar, the village administrative officer of Welioya inaugurated the building and gave a warm welcome to the new preschool students along with the CSC staff and the parents. After the short inauguration, we had the parents meeting where parents were given proper guidance on how to care for the children.

**Inauguration of Pre GEL programme at Annfield and Abbotsligh estates.** On 11<sup>th</sup> of February, the principal of Annfield along with the English teacher and 9<sup>th</sup> STD students gave a warm welcome to CSC Loyola Campus to start Pre Gel programme and assured his fullest support to us in his opening remarks. Fr. Premkumar explained the history and the programme of CSC Loyola Campus and requested the students to remain with CSC Loyola

Campus for 8 years until they complete BA Sustainable Development online degree programme offered by St. Xavier University, Bhubaneshwar, India. Around 50 students along with a few parents participated in the event. Similar event took place at Abbotsligh School on 13<sup>th</sup> February. My activities at the Kakuma Refugee camp with the JRS and my break in Nairobi during the month of February could be summarized as Accompaniment with support.

We were blessed with a Jesuit Tertian from Dublin joining us for his apostolic immersion.



Robert Murphy from New Orleans, a professional physiotherapist joined our JRS team on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2020. It was a providential coincidence. It was in September 2019, that one of his Theology companions from Boston, Alex from the Province of AOR connected me with Robert, when he was thinking of his apostolic experiment. I bombarded him with news, photos and video clips of our JRS work in Kakuma, especially with the news from the department of

Children with Special needs. After a long process of deliberation with his superiors, Robert is here with us

now. We prepared a very systematic and practical Program for Robert to acquire his skills and empower our teachers, occupational therapists and lead trainers.

When we were preparing a plan of activities for Robert, one of our staff questioned saying, "It seems this



program doesn't include any resting time for Fr. Robert". I immediately responded saying, "He is a Jesuit. We Jesuits die with our boots on. We are trained for that. We take rest in Peace with God".It proved well in bringing awareness of Jesuits' way of life to JRS. Robert landed in Kakuma at 9.30 in the morning on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of February and at 10.30 he was in the camp visiting the children with cerebral palsy even in the heavy rain.

Robert visits every centre and imparts his knowledge and skills to our staff and meets the children with physical disabilities and severe cerebral palsy and even energizes the parents. I



walk with him and support the program logistically. Robert enthusiastically celebrates the Eucharist in our JRS residence and at the Mass centres during the weekend. He enjoys the pastoral activities so much. I enjoy the Jesuit Company with Robert who is energetic, methodical and lovable and especially his noisy affectionate greetings, "LASANTHAAAAAA"



Fr. Sanjeewa from our Province in Sri Lanka contacted me and wanted support from me to get some video clips and voice cuts, to accompany his presentation on Pope Francis' intentions for the Month of February on Refugees and Migrants. I did my best by giving him some from the Kakuma camp. One Saturday evening (Kenyan time), I received many whatsApp calls from Sri Lanka, even from Canada and USA, "Fr., we saw you and your work in Kenya on Verbum TV". I was really happy that the Church in Sri Lanka is becoming aware of the plight and pain of refugees; the most

beloved of the LORD. Thanks to Sanjeewa for appreciating and valuing our work of JRS.


