PWPN and EYM Asia-Pacific Meeting in Seoul, South Korea from 24 to 29 April 2023.

After a long gap of six years, a meeting of PWPN and EYM was organized in the Capital City of Seoul in South Korea for which the resource persons were Fr Frederic Fornos, SJ, the International Director of PWPN and EYM, Rome and Mrs Bettina Raed, International in-charge of the 'Way of the Heart' from Argentina, South America. The meeting had forty-two participants from 12 countries out of which 10 attended online.

The training on the 'Way of the Heart' began on 24 April morning and lasted till 27 April afternoon. The process followed was personal reflection, sharing in groups, and general sharing. We really went very deep into each point and were touched by the depth it offered and learnt to harmonize our hearts with the Heart of Christ as He sees how the humanity is facing the challenges and the mission of the Church. The last day was dedicated for evaluation as well as business session on the process of electing a new Asia-Pacific Coordinator and the venue of the next meeting in 2025.



The program was very well organized by Fr Woobae Sohn, the Korean National Director, Ms Stella and their small team at Don Bosco Youth Centre in the heart of the city. I found the Korean hospitality exquisite with every detail taken care of. I was also impressed by the cleanliness and discipline of the people and no wonder they have made so much progress in every field as they are sincere and hardworking.

Fr Xavier Tharamel, SJ (KER) and I were very fortunate to be invited for this program and we really enjoyed and benefitted from it.

Human Fraternity Forum Established in Ooty and Coimbatore

Franciscan Missionaries of Mary (Coimbatore) and Islamic Studies Association (Delhi) jointly organized two one-day seminars on 'Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together' at Ooty on 26 May 2023 and at Coimbatore on 27 May 2023.

At the seminar the participants discussed the salient features of the declaration 'Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together', co-authored by His Holiness Pope Francis and His Eminence the Grand Imam of Al-Azhar Sheikh Ahmed El Tayeb. The participants found the document inviting "all persons who have faith in God and faith in human fraternity to unite and work together so that it may serve as a guide for future generations to advance a culture of mutual respect in the awareness of the

great divine grace that makes all human beings brothers and sisters." The participants came from different walks of life that included children and transgender persons. Adopting a participatory methodology, the participants discussed social interventions for a social order worthy of humanity (Gaudium et Spes, 24). They felt that the document is truly a model for interfaith harmony and human solidarity. They resolved to take inspiration and renew their commitment to stand together as one human family. They established a 'Human Fraternity Forum' to put into action the key teachings of the document.





Youth

In order to help youth animators to have sufficient knowledge and skills for an effective youth ministry, a zonal youth animators' course was organized at Upasana, Jamshedpur for central zone provinces of Ranchi, Jamshedpur, Dumka, Hazaribagh and Madhya Pradesh from 5 to 9 June 2023. A Historic Milestone for the Students' Council

Jnana Deepa (JD), Institute of Philosophy and Theology, Pune, always gives utmost importance to the active participation of its students in all its academic and co-curricular activities. The JD Students' Council, accompanied by a faculty member, functions with full vigour and involvement. It is formed every year by an elaborate procedure of elections in two rounds. From every batch of the bachelors' level, four student-representatives and one each from the post-graduate students of Philosophy and Theology streams are elected; no student is nominated by the staff, nor the administration. The elected representatives take part in all the Academic Council meetings, including the Senate meetings of Jnana Deepa, with full voting rights. For this academic year 2023-24, the elections were successfully conducted, under the guidance of Prof. Fr S. Stephen Jayard, the Animator of the Students' Council. On 16 June, 2023, the new Students' Council was installed in a simple but meaningful ceremony, attended by all the staff and students.

The unique feature of the Students' Council this year is that, for the first time in the long history of 130 years since 1893 (established as Papal Seminary in Kandy), a woman religious has been elected as the Chairperson of the Students' Council. She is Sr Asha Maria Jose, MSMI. The appointment of a woman as Chairperson is a very significant event in today's context. As the Church prepares itself for the great synod, where the opinions and the rights of women are taken seriously, JD is extremely happy to see a woman religious leading the Students' Council. We wish her all the best and resolve to work towards a holistic society, where women's dignity and rights are duly recognized without any gender discrimination.
