Introduction

The spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius have made a remarkable impact on the world. Though there are many kinds of spirituality introduced by different saints at different ages, Ignatian Spirituality stands unique and remarkable. It has changed the lives of many people, brought them to the Lord, given us a number of saints.

During the European Renaissance, at the beginning of the modern age, Christians were restless to find new holiness. They wanted saints who, though unworldly in their desires, remained fully in the world and wise in the ways of the world, searching for a spirituality that would combine ancient prayer and work.

When the Spirituality of that age focused either only on work or prayer like monks in the monasteries, there was the need to combine both. people sought after a new form of spirituality that embraced the beauty and goodness of the world, and trusted the power of thoughtful human enterprise to make good things happen in this world, shaping and reshaping it as best they could through God's redemptive love and guidance. 'We are Monks in the market place' is phrase attribute to Jesuits and Fr Nadal says, "Road is our Home."

Ignatius Spiritual Exercises inspire us to find God in all things: at every situation, relationship, and experience of human life—in the daily stuff of working, raising children, caring for neighbours, seeking justice in civic life, fighting for the rights of the people, working for the upliftment of the poor, protecting the earth, and building the human community, as well as in experiences of friendship, of solidarity in a common cause, in times of rejoicing and great happiness, times of sorrow and grieving, and times of loneliness and fear.

Characteristics of Ignatian Spirituality

1. It sees life and the whole universe as a gift calling forth wonder and gratefulness.

2. It gives ample scope to imagination and emotion as well as intellect.

3. It seeks to find the divine in all things – in all peoples and cultures, in all areas of study

and learning, in every human experience, and (for the Christian) especially in the person

of Jesus.

4. It cultivates critical awareness of personal and social evil but points to God's love as

more powerful than any evil.

5. It stresses freedom, the need for discernment, and responsible action.

6. It empowers people to become leaders in service, men and women for others, whole

persons of solidarity, building a more just and humane world.

7. It holds the personal relationship with Christ and loves for the Church as the foundation

for continuing God's mission.

8. It considers the union of minds and hearts as the basis for our community as we listen

for our God present among us, admitting no division based on ethnicity, nationality,

background, age or gender.
