
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Union of Hearts and Minds as Companions in the Society

INTRODUCTION:

From the day I joined the Society of Jesus to this day, one of the aspects that I cherish in my life is community life. It is really joyful to come together as one family bound by companionship. Born somewhere in a different family and raised in a different culture and language, we are today united as companions in the lap of the Mother Society. Let us thank God for giving us the gift of companionship. There are many diversities amidst us yet the aspect of companionship is what builds up our community life. The union of hearts and minds is the heart and breath of our community life. Called by God and united by the Society of Jesus, companionship is the life in union of hearts and minds.

Companionship cherishes happiness in the victory of our own Jesuits, sharing their suffering as our own, celebrating everyone's achievements as our own family, and shouldering the failures of others. Although there are many kinds of relationships in this world, companionship always has a special place in human relationships. Companionship is the dimension of divine love that wells up from the depths of the heart. Our Mother Society is united in the umbilical cord of fellowship that evolves into a bond of affection, and blossoms in filial love.

Readings:

St Ignatius, in the Constitutions of the Society of Jesus, no.655, says, "The society cannot be preserved or governed or, consequently, attain the aim it seeks, for the greater glory of God unless its members are united among themselves and with their head. My dear friends in the Lord. When our community life flourishes, the whole religious life is sound. The general norms of the society

Symbolic Offerings:

Response: Accept, Lord, accept our Offering.

1. Candle: A candle that gives light to others by losing itself is a symbol of dedication. In the way of our Lord Jesus, who calls us to let our light shine before people, we also offer these candles to God to illuminate our lives through kind words and loving understanding, and to live the companionship of Jesus. Lord, we offer you.

Answer: Accept, Lord, accept our Offering.

2. Flowers: fragrant flowers are a symbol of God's amazing creation. We are created in the image of God, and we marvel at the greatness of God who crowns the little grass and the flower. We are gathered into the companionship of Jesus. We, who have realized the value of creation, in the company of Christ, pray for the blessing that grow in the union of hearts and minds and sing your praises. Lord, we offer you.

Answer: Accept, Lord, accept our Offering.

3. Grains: The fruit of human labour is a symbol of God's gift of sustenance to man. Companionship is the sustenance of our community life, just as the fruit that nourishes human life is bestowed upon us by God's grace. Just as a seed cannot bear fruit unless it falls into the soil, dies, sprouts and grows up we cannot fully bear fruit unless we overcome our divisions and be united in the companionship of Christ. We pray for the grace that we may grow more and more in

companionship and offer ourselves wholeheartedly for the greater glory of God. Lord, we offer you.

4. Youth: We present our young people at the feet of God, praying for the blessing that they may grow up in the characteristics of Christ's companionship and may bear witness to his love and grow in the divine values of Christ. Lord, we offer you.

Reflection:

- 1. Have we grown in the union of hearts and minds as companions in the Society of Jesus?
- 2. What are the barriers to me growing more deeply in companionship?
- 3. What efforts should I make to cross divisions and unite in the companionship of Christ to do the work of God more actively?
- 4. How to unite young people in the Christian way as companions of Christ for our ministry?
- 5. It is the need of the hour to unite the youth who are caught up in the clutches of cinema craze, consumer culture, etc., as companions of Jesus. Through what kind of initiatives can young people be united as companions of Christ?
- 6. In our educational institutions, is it possible to bring Ignatian values into the lives of young people by grouping the young people in the workplaces under the name "Inigo Youth" and explaining the life history of Ignatius once a month?
