A. Indigenous-Led Participatory and Cumulative Impact Assessment on Traditional Ecosystem Services (ASI-JRDS)

The study on Indigenous-Led Participatory and Cumulative Impact Assessment on Traditional Ecosystem Services was funded by Aluminium Stewardship Initiative (ASI), based in Australia. The objective of the study was to evolve a cumulative impact assessment methodology on traditional ecosystems services by the participation and leadership of the local, affected indigenous communities. It is an attempt to evolve a comprehensive impact assessment methodology keeping in mind the contexts of the indigenous communities in Sweden, Australia, Ghana, Suriname and India. The study is completed and the final report is submitted to ASI in the month of July, 2023.

B. A Historical Study of Tribal Chiefdoms of Jharkhand: Kherwar of Ramgarh, Munda of Bundu, Bhumij of Jungle Mahal, Nagwansi of Ranchi, Santhal of Hazaribagh & Others.

A historical study of tribal chiefdoms of Jharkhand: Kherwar of Ramgarh, Munda of Bundu, Bhumij of Jungle Mahal, Nagwansi of Ranchi, Santhal of Hazaribagh & Others was offered by the Tribal Research Institute, Ranchi, Jharkhand. The objective of the study was to reconstitute the histories of the dynasties and their role in state formation, tracing a history of the tribal chiefdoms, their way of life, governance systems and the impact of Sanskritization on the development of the Chiefdom and its

people.

# C. Biodiversity Conservation Health and Wellbeing of the Indigenous Peoples:

Since the year 2020, a long-term online meetings, negotiations and presentations were going on with the Professors and Researchers of the University of Alberta, Canada to engage into a global research programme on "Biodiversity Conservation, Health and Wellbeing of the Indigenous Peoples."

On 30th August at Chennai, I led a group of 15 NGO child rights activists in a planning meeting for doing a study on "Ten Years of POCSO ACT, 2012: Evaluating Implementation Status in Tamil Nadu" as well as for carrying out post-research advocacy activities with TN Govt. for policy changes. This was followed by a second planning meeting on 25th Sept. in Chennai to prepare research tools to collect data related to the research theme.




